WANT KIDS TO BRUSH THEIR TEETH? FIRST 5 SAN BERNARDINO BRINGS THE DENTIST (AND MORE) TO THE CLASSROOM!

"Little Teeth, Big Responsibility" School Visit Kicks Off Children's Dental Health Month with pop-up hygienist, book reading, Potter the Otter and more for young children in Ontario

- WHAT: An event at Hawthorne Elementary School in the City of Ontario will bring free dental screenings and more to 48 preschoolers. As part of the "Little Teeth, Big Responsibility" campaign by First 5 San Bernardino and Smile SBC, the 3- and 4-year-olds will also get a surprise visit from the giant Potter the Otter mascot and a theatrical reading of the popular Potter the Otter Visits the Dentist book, where they'll learn how to brush and floss. They'll even go home with a toothbrush kit and their very own Potter the Otter Visits the Dentist book!
- WHY: Tooth decay is preventable, but it remains the most common and chronic childhood disease. Children with poor oral health are more likely to miss school and experience academic struggles, with lower grades than their healthier peers. Though baby teeth are temporary, they are important as they help children chew and talk correctly and form healthy adult teeth. A 2018 survey by Smile SBC and the Center for Oral Health indicate that two out of three kindergarten children in San Bernardino County have already had tooth decay.

Together, First 5 San Bernardino and Smile SBC share the importance of pediatric oral healthcare every year through their "Little Teeth, Big Responsibility" campaign in alignment with National Children's Dental Health Month in February. San Bernardino County parents, caregivers and children receive free resources and information about proper oral care for children aged 5 and under.

- Dozens of 3- and 4-year-olds receiving free dental screenings by the <u>Friendly Flosser</u>; children receiving brushing and flossing tips as they sit in the dental chair
- A surprise visit by the Potter the Otter mascot, who encourages children to get their dental screening and brush their teeth
- A theatrical reading of Potter the Otter Visits the Dentist, all teaching kids about dental health through song and dance
- Excited students receiving free Potter the Otter Visits the Dentist books, dental report cards and other oral health giveaways to take home
