## First 5 San Bernardino Hosts Birthday Party at Chino Youth Museum To Encourage Parents to 'Gift a Kid a Book'

Birthday party for Potter the Otter also celebrates 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of popular place for children's birthday parties

WHAT:

<u>First 5 San Bernardino</u>, in partnership with the <u>Chino Youth Museum</u>, is celebrating Potter the Otter's birthday with free books and interactive play for children. The *Gift a Kid a Book* event encourages parents to consider giving books for special occasions, and also celebrates the 25th anniversary of the Chino Youth Museum, a popular place where families host birthday parties.

The event will include story time with Potter the Otter, interactive songs, exploration of the museum's interactive kid-sized exhibits, and a festive birthday party complete with cake, crafts and every child receiving a wrapped book. Families will also receive swag bags with an additional book to give for another birthday party!

WHY:

San Bernardino County <u>literacy rates in young children have declined</u> since the pandemic. First 5 San Bernardino is in its third year of <u>Gift a Kid a Book</u>, a campaign that promotes the importance of reading to young children, provides reading resources, community events and free books to San Bernardino County families with children under 5 years old.

Science tells us 90 percent of a child's brain develops in the first five years of their life. Reading plays a crucial role in brain development and the way children view learning is shaped very early on. The *Gift a Kid a Book* campaign encourages families to give books to children ages 0-5 for birthdays and special occasions, emphasizing reading as a tool to build strong brains, calm nervous systems and nurture meaningful family connections.
