	 <u>Child Abuse Prevention Month</u> The month of April has been established as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Declared by presidential proclamation in 1983. During this month and throughout the year, First 5 San Bernardino (F5SB) is dedicated to supporting families to reduce the risk of child abuse and neglect. There are many activities supporting the organized efforts of child abuse prevention in our County such as: 18th Annual Shine-A-Light on Child Abuse Awards Breakfast on April 7 9th Annual Care 4 Kids Run sponsored by CASA on April 23 Celebration of children with the "Children Are Our Future" event sponsored by Children's Fund, April 19 at the San Manuel/66er's Stadium. Featured on page 4 of the ED report, in the month of April, Children's Network invites community, providers and partners to free training and discussion on the "Adverse Childhood Experiences" or (ACE) Study during their regional collaborative meeting series. The consequences of abuse and neglect can be profound and can last long into the life cycle. San Bernardino County stands strong in ensuring our children are safe, healthy, nurtured and eager to learn and succeed in school and in life – certainly a goal of FSSB. <u>Reminder</u> Budget Workshop, May 4, 2016 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. Commission Meeting begins at 3:30 pm. Today marks the last Commission meeting with Dr. Ron Powell. Dr. Powell is invited to return and attend the May 4, 2016 meeting for an official "swearing out" oath and resolution presentation Commissioner. Her appointment was approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 5, 2016. Stacy will fill the vacancy created by Dr. Powell.
	Advocacy Day, April 5, 2016 First 5's across the State participated in Advocacy Day at the State Capitol. Thank you to two very valuable partners and collaborators, Diana Alexander from Preschool Services Department and James Moses from Child Care Resource Center who joined F5SB staff at the Capitol to spread the First 5 message to legislators. Our collective message was about the impact of First 5 and our top priorities which include quality advanting activity identification and intervention family attractions

include quality education, early identification and intervention, family strengthening and oral health initiatives. Because our vast county has some shared representatives, F5SB was able to coordinate with neighbors like First 5 Riverside, First 5 Kern and even First 5 Tulare, participating in team visits to some of our legislators and sharing a collective message.

Consent

We had no specific "ask" of our legislators other than recognizing that 1 in 3 children in our County is a "First 5 Kid", touched in some way by our initiatives, our services, our contract providers and systems of support.

Legislators were asked to prioritize early childhood development and education policies to improve outcomes for children and families. Legislators were informed that although our funding is declining, First 5 is exploring new, data-informed, efficient and cost-effective ways to leverage and meet the needs of children in the most critical ages of 0-5. This includes eliminating duplication and the creation of "work arounds" by exploring resources that are already available such as with Denti-Cal for Oral Health Care. Legislators were asked to support maximizing and ensuring that families have "access" to the services that are currently funded and provided for through such sources as Local Control Funding, Health and Human Services, Affordable Care Act, etc. F5SB staff look forward to returning to share with legislators after the Governor's May Revise is released.

Background Information	QRIS is a system that defines quality standards for early care and education programs, measures programs against these standards, offers and connects
	educators to training and professional development opportunities and helps parents and caregivers find quality programs for their children. First 5 San Bernardino (F5SB) has adopted development of a QRIS as a strategy to support the organization's mission and vision for the purpose of promoting, supporting, and improving early development of children from the prenatal stage to five years of age in San Bernardino County.
	At the July 8, 2015 meeting, specifics relating to the IMPACT program and its funding opportunity were presented to the Commission. F5SB applied as the Lead Agency on behalf of the County's QRIS Consortium and was approved and awarded \$2,241,758 over a five-year period in Phase 1 for "base-layer funding." This authorized F5SB to approve and distribute stipends from these funds, to the Operational Partners (OP) who have given countless hours from their regular positions to plan and build a comprehensive QRIS Strategic Plan. This work positioned the County Consortium to be eligible for Phase II funding in the amount of \$3,205,839, also over a 5-year period, to support and operationalize the plan.
	The Operational Partners named in the IMPACT application and eligible to receive the stipends are:
	 San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools San Bernardino County Preschool Services Department Child Care Resource Center California State University San Bernardino

The OP's will continue to support the implementation of the local San Bernardino QRIS Strategic Plan. This includes the Design and Systems Functions, Partnership Commitments, Local Governance and Strategic Financing.

F5SB and the QRIS Consortium meet on a monthly basis. The San Bernardino County QRIS Consortium has committed to achieving the components included in the State of California Rating Matrix such as Child Development and School Readiness through Child Observation, Developmental and Health Screenings as well as Teacher Qualifications, Effective Teacher Child Interactions, Optimal Early Learning Environments, including ratios and group size.

First 5 IMPACT funding will be utilized as a leveraged resource to support quality improvement work through a system and mission developed and coordinated by the QRIS Consortium.

Upon Commission approval authorizing payment via a service agreement (see Attachment A) and with the authorized signatures from OP's, the Commission will execute payment in the amount of \$8,000 for each participating OP not to exceed \$16,000 per organization. The stipend is a one-time only provision.

The IMPACT application and the award of stipends to OP's is in support of the Commission's Strategic Plan:

SPA 2: Systems and Networks wherein F5SB is providing leadership in the development of this QRIS – a system that supports children prenatal through age 5, and results in sustainable and collective impact.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

I. BACKGROUND

Successful County Early Learning and Development Systems, including a Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS), are built on broad-based stakeholder participation and effective governance structures.

The Commission has selected QRIS as a strategy to support the First 5 San Bernardino's mission and vision for the purpose of promoting, supporting, and improving early development of children from the prenatal stage to 5 years of age in San Bernardino County. QRIS is a system that defines quality standards for early care and education programs, measures programs against these standards, offers and connects educators to training and professional development opportunities, and helps parents and caregivers find quality programs for their children. With a QRIS, communities have a new tool to increase access to quality early learning experiences for children 0 to 5 years of age. This system supports existing and aspiring early care and education providers by helping them recognize what they can do to best support the development of young children in their care. The framework also serves as a tool to help early learning programs determine their level of quality and identify a plan for improvement to meet higher standards of quality. In addition to helping programs and providers, the QRIS offers parents and caregivers a tool for recognizing quality settings and selecting programs that best fit the needs of their children.

As a member of the San Bernardino County QRIS Consortium (Consortium), the Commission has elected to provide stipends to QRIS Operational Partners who have been identified as required local consortium participants. The Operational Partners have selected Key Decision Makers (KDM) within their organization who acknowledge the process for regularly bringing together the local consortium and endorse the developed governance structure. This includes delineating the decision-making process, identifying and defining roles and responsibilities, and creating an alignment across the partnerships and QRIS efforts.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish the roles and responsibilities in the efforts of the Commission and Operational Partners in the planning, development, and implementation of the QRIS.

III. COMMISSION RESPONSIBILITIES

Commission shall:

- A. Provide assistance and facilitate, as applicable, the planning, development, and implementation of a QRIS.
- B. Provide coordination, including participation in meetings, development of media, advocacy, and develop strategies for sustainability of the QRIS.
- C. Identify a Commission Staff Analyst as the liaison to interact with Operational Partner staff regarding QRIS activities.

IV. OPERATIONAL PARTNER RESPONSIBILITIES

Operational Partner shall:

- A. Identify a staff member within the agency as the liaison to interact with Commission staff regarding QRIS activities to ensure engagement as an Operational Partner by their organization to the Consortium.
- B. Identity a staff member to work on Steering Committee efforts as San Bernardino County QRIS Consortium member.
